The Joan L. Ellenbogen Memorial Fellowship

GUIDELINES

The New York Bar Foundation is pleased to announce it will provide funding in the form of two grant awards to public service or other nonprofit organizations in the State of New York to conduct *The Joan L. Ellenbogen Memorial Fellowship*. The fellow will assist the grantee organization in matters relating to matrimonial law.

Grant awards will be available for two organizations to conduct a fellowship during the 2011 fall semester. Each grant award will have a value of \$5,000.00.

The grant award will provide funding for the fellow who will be selected by the grantee organization.

The fellowship will be made available by the grantee organization to a third-year law student enrolled in a law school in New York State during the fall 2011 semester or newly graduated law student who has been awarded a degree from a New York State law school. The newly graduated student will have received a law degree in 2011.

The goal of the fellowships is to encourage lawyers and students in the practice of matrimonial law so that individuals will have access to representation and a greater understanding of their rights in matters relating to matrimonial and family law in New York State.

Qualified organizations with the need for a matrimonial law fellow are eligible to apply for the \$5,000.00 grant by **October 15, 2010** to receive funding in 2011 to conduct the fellowship. A grant application and grant guidelines are accessible at <http://www.tnybf.org/grantapp.htm>.

The grants will be awarded by the Foundation's Board of Directors during its January 2011 meeting with the funding available in mid to late July.

If a law school student, the fellow will work 20 hours per week as determined by the organization for ten weeks. If a law school graduate, the fellow will work a minimum of 30 hours but not more than 40 hours per week. The fellowships will take place from September 13 through November 19, 2011.

Joan L. Ellenbogen

Joan L. Ellenbogen was a graduate of New York University School of Law and was admitted to the New York Bar in 1965. From 1979 when the law firm of Ellenbogen & Goldstein, P.C., New York City, was founded with Marcia C. Goldstein, until her death in 2001, Ms. Ellenbogen practiced matrimonial and family law. In 1980, she was the Founding President of the Women's Bar Association of the State of New York, a state-wide organization dedicated to the advancement of women in society and in the legal profession. She was the first woman Chair of the Executive Committee of the Association of the Bar of

the City of New York. Ms. Ellenbogen was a member of the First Department Disciplinary Committee

and served on the Board of Trustees of the Legal Aid Society. She was a member of the Executive Committee of the Family Law Section of the New York State Bar Association and in 2001 she was the recipient of the Association's prestigious Ruth G. Shapiro Award.

Her many other professional activities included serving as President of the Alumni Association of New York University School of Law; being one of the organizers of the Judges and Lawyers Breast Cancer Alert; serving as a member of the Joint Committee on Judicial Administration established by Governor Mario Cuomo and former Chief Judge Sol Wachtler; and serving as a Commissioner on the Commission on Judicial Nominations to the Court of Appeals. She was a fellow of the Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers, New York Chapter, a Diplomate in the American College of Family Trial Lawyers, and a frequent lecturer to the bench and bar on matrimonial law. During her distinguished professional career, Ms. Ellenbogen received many awards and tributes. Ms. Ellenbogen lost her battle with pancreatic cancer on October 18, 2001 at the age of 59.
