# The Foundation is seeking nominations for the Lifetime Achievement Award

The NY Bar Foundation's Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes extraordinary living Fellows of the Foundation, their distinguished careers, and their exemplary service to the public good and the profession.

The award will be bestowed upon a Fellow who demonstrates outstanding professional achievement, dedication to the legal profession, and commitment to the ideals of the Foundation.

### Nominees should embody the Principles of the Fellows:

- Understands that the law is a learned occupation and is inescapably a public calling. A Fellow
  appreciates that the combined professional effort of all lawyers nurtures and sustains the rule of
  law and American democracy. A Fellow strives to develop, uphold, and maintain these core values
  of the profession.
- Embraces lawyer independence, ethical behavior, self-renewal, competence, responsibility, an appreciation for the historical continuity and tradition of the profession, and respect for clients, adversaries, and the courts.
- Acknowledges that the practice of law is a helping profession and that attorneys, as custodians of the legal system, have enhanced obligations of service to the community, to the profession, and to promote justice through the rule of law.

## The Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes these ideals.

The Award will be presented during the Annual Assembly of the Fellows which will be held virtually in January, 2023. The recipient will also be acknowledged by Foundation President, Carla Palumbo, during the Foundation Annual Meeting prior to the House of Delegates Meeting January 20, 2023.

#### **Nomination Criteria:**

- a Fellow of the Foundation who has achieved exemplary stature in the profession
- embodies the Principles of the Fellows
- has made significant contributions to New York's legal community and the Foundation
- has advanced the mission of The New York Bar Foundation
- · has meaningfully advanced the public interest
- has encouraged others to be involved

#### Nominations should include:

- One copy of the completed Nomination Form
- One letter of recommendation
- One copy of a narrative (500-word maximum) detailing the aforementioned criteria
